Tour Korea! Post Adoption Services for Adoptees

See below for an overview of available services. Upon registration, you'll receive a Registration Form for the following services in your Tour Korea! Registration Confirmation Packet. Please note that clients are responsible for additional transportation fees, assessed as applicable.

Foster mother meeting: Adoptees and their families meet with the person who provided their foster care before they joined their adoptive families (per information available in the Korean file).

Included in price of the tour. This service is initiated by your U.S. placing agency.

Tour-related birth family search*: Using the Korean agency file, a search is conducted to find an adoptee's birth family (per information available in the Korean file). Includes expediting the search as part of the tour, communication with birth family before and during the tour, and translation of meetings.

The cost for this service is \$350. Birth family search is initiated by your U.S. placing agency.

Re-establishing previous birth relative contact:

For adoptees already in contact with their birth families. Children's Home, in cooperation with the Korean agency, will re-establish contact with relatives and assist in scheduling a meeting. This service is initiated by your U.S. placing agency.

The cost for this service is \$150. If existing contact information is inaccurate, search fees may apply.

Birth clinic, hospital visit, or finding site visit: Adopted persons and their families can visit the hospital or clinic where the adoptee was born and/or the site where the adoptee was found (as information is available in the file).

This often requires side trip(s) where additional costs are assessed as applicable.

Other customized side trips in Korea: Children's Home can assist with visiting locations of personal significance not included in the tour itinerary. Side trips may require an overnight stay and/or not attending other scheduled itinerary activities.

Side trips may be subject to a \$50 cancellation fee.

File review meeting in Korea: The adoptee looks at his/her physical adoption file at the agency in Korea in a meeting conducted with a Korean agency social worker.

Included in price of the tour.


* These services are available to adopted persons over the age of 13 if adopted via Eastern Social Welfare Society and Social Welfare Society, and over the age of 18 if adopted via Korea Social Service and Holt Children's Services.
