- A nod to our work to help raise children and raise up our communities






OUR MISSIO

We know children thrive when they are given security, opportunity and a loving family.

At Children's Home, we recognize that adoption is a lifelong journey and believe that all members of the adoption circle should have access to education, support and resources at every stage of life.

FOSTER CARE ADOPTION

For the first time in recent history, our combined adoption programs placed more children from Minnesota foster care than any other program — exceeding our contractual expectations. As part of our work, we offer diverse support for foster adoption families including child-specific recruitment and kinship adoption.

INFANT ADOPTION

We help families in Maryland, Minnesota, and Virginia create an open adoption plan that benefits the child, the birth parents and adoptive parents. We have increased and modernized our outreach services to help more families connect to expectant parents.

INTERNATIONAL ADOPTION

Through a variety of international adoption programs, we are able to find families across the U.S. for children who wait globally. Our advocacy efforts focus on helping children who have a wide spectrum of identified needs.

POST ADOPTION SERVICES

We continue to increase our services for those touched by adoption. Throughout each year, we host support groups for birth parents, adoptees, parents of adopted adults and children. We're also meeting the increased need for navigating the complexities of reunion, especially with the advent of DNA search and the increased connectivity that the internet provides.

Our heart and our work is centered in the wellbeing of children. In addition to adoption services, we also support children and families in the following ways:

ADOPTION SUPPORT FUND

We provide grants designed specifically to help with the placement of older children, sibling groups and children with identified needs. Grants are also available for domestic and international post adoption services.

GLOBAL FAMILY SUPPORT

With our worldwide partners, Global Family Support ensures children living in orphanages receive the best care possible and supports economic development projects that help families remain intact.

PREGNANCY SERVICES

Our professionally trained staff offer non-directive counseling, emotional support and practical resources for expectant mothers and/or fathers.

FINDING CONNECTION AND COMMONALITIES IN REUNION

Thinking it a mistake, Ruth Rose ignored a letter from Children's Home she received in September 2016. A second, corrected letter prompted her response — profoundly changing her life and that of her son she placed for adoption in 1960.

Bill Monson always wanted to find his birth parents. By request, he waited until his adoptive father died 24 years ago to begin his search. His adoptive mom had passed away when Bill was a teen. Within months, *Ancestry.com* connected him with his birth father and six half-siblings.

Finding Ruth proved more challenging. Bill didn't know his birth name, and the laws at the time limited the information Children's Home, which placed him with his adoptive family, could provide. In 2016, Children's Home reopened its search, writing to Ruth.

Our Post Adoption Services monitored letters and calls between Ruth and Bill, ensuring their safety and comfort in the budding relationship. More than comfortable, both were thrilled!

Recalling their first meeting in January 2017, Bill said, "That was the hardest door I've ever walked through. There were a lot of mixed emotions."


In less than a year, their lives have been fully integrated. They talk most days and meet weekly to banter about shared interests like classic cars and fishing while playing cribbage, a mutual favorite. Bill has gained a relationship with a younger brother, Ruth's only other child, and his two kids. Ruth is tickled to have three more grandchildren. She was an honored guest at Bill's daughter's wedding in September.

"Finding Bill has changed my life!" gushed Ruth, who held back from finding her son for fear of disrupting his life. "You don't know how thankful I am."

"Other than my aunt and uncle who I lived with [when I was pregnant], I never told anyone about Bill," she said, reflecting on giving birth at a Saint Paul home for unwed mothers. "Once I could finally tell people, it was wonderful."

Despite having a rich life with his adoptive family, including a sister and a brother, Bill echoes Ruth's delight in their reunion.

The best interest of the child is at the heart of all we do:

GRIEVING THE LOSS OF A SON AND FATHER

Sonny's unexpected death happened when his daughter, Marianna, was just three months old. He had been battling drug addiction and had developed a blood infection which, ultimately, took his life. Sonny's mother and father, Lena and Dan, were grieving the death of their 23-year-old son, when they found out Marianna's mother was also struggling with drug addiction.

When Marianna was born, she was going through withdrawals. "She cried for 23 hours straight until she got her fix," said Lena. "When we found this out, we were brought to tears." Lena and Dan had been unaware of all that Marianna had endured during the first three months of her life.

"When Sonny passed away, he was sober," said Lena. "He told me he was going to do it for Marianna." Both Marianna's parents were working towards sobriety, but after Sonny passed away, Marianna's mom relapsed. "That's when she called me and told me she was losing her parental rights," said Lena. "So of course I jumped in and fought to adopt her."

"I was told I wasn't being considered to become the caretaker for my granddaughter," said Lena. "We had to go to court." Her lawyer pointed her towards Children's Home for assistance. That is when she finally felt some relief. "At first, I felt like the world was against me, but then the staff at Children's Home were so helpful. They offered me so many resources and support."

Lena and Dan became foster parents so that Marianna could live with them while the adoption finalized. "Now we're grandma-mom and grandpa-dad," said Lena. As their family works to heal from the trauma they've endured during the past four years, they take comfort in the fact that they get to spend their life together.

THE CHILDREN'S HOME FOSTER CARE ADOPTION

program serves children who are in state guardianship or tribal jurisdiction with a goal of permanency through adoption.

WE HELP FAMILIES prepare for adopting children from foster care with a home study, pre-adoptive training, foster care licensing and ongoing support throughout every step of the process.

A LIFETIME OF SERVICE TO CHILDREN AND FAMILIES

Mrs. Hyun Sook Han was introduced to Children's Home in 1970, during a four month trip from Seoul, South Korea to the United States. In this short trip, she made life-changing connections. She introduced Children's Home to the Social Welfare Society of Korea, which was instrumental in the future success of our international adoption program.

A few years later, Mrs. Han and her husband decided they wanted to move from Seoul to Minnesota.

Mrs. Han reconnected with Children's Home's then executive director, Roger Toogood, and was hired as a social worker. During her nearly 30 years with the organization, her role extended far beyond social work

The Korean children and the American parents matched together through Children's Home were in need of support and guidance. In response, Mrs. Han created a handbook for parents of Korean adoptees providing the parents with knowledge and tools to help their children live in connection with their birth country. She also started Korea Day — a workshop for adoptive parents to learn about Korean culture.

In addition, Mrs. Han started many programs for Korean adoptees. Children's Day, a traditional Korean celebration dedicated to children, wasn't celebrated in Minnesota until Mrs. Han created a space for it. She also implemented post adoption support groups.

At times, Mrs. Han was so dedicated to the success of Korean children that she was working four nights a

week in addition to her full days. She made a lot of trips to and from Korea to foster communication between Korea and America — keeping international adoption at the forefront of government and media discussions.

Shortly after Mrs. Han began her career at Children's Home, she got involved with fundraising by starting the Korean Benefit Dinner. The first year, the dinner raised \$3,700. At its height, the benefit raised \$70,000.

After retiring in 2003, Mrs. Han spent the next seven years as a member of the Children's Home board of directors. She was the first former employee who was invited to participate as a board member. Now that her time on the board is complete, she continues to volunteer her time for the Korean community in Minnesota. She has spent the past six years as the president of the Korean American Association — an organization that supports Koreans living in Minnesota.

Most recently, in November 2017, Mrs. Han hosted her 80th birthday celebration with the proceeds benefiting the Children's Home Han Endowment Fund. "I started the endowment fund with \$10,000 in 1995 after my husband's death," she said. More than 20 years later, she continues to show her commitment to children and families by donating her time and skills while fundraising.

We are thankful for Mrs. Han's dedication to helping both Korean birth mothers and their children.

FRED C. AND KATHERINE B. ANDERSEN FOUNDATION EXTENDS LEGACY OF COMPASSION

Many knew Fred C. Andersen, the president of Andersen Corporation from 1914 until 1960, as a man of high ideals and integrity, and as a humanitarian. Equally noteworthy, his wife. Katherine, worked as a scientist after earning her master's degree in a time when women rarely attained higher education.

The couple provided leadership and financial support to many organizations; among them the Mayo Clinic and several youth organizations, including the Big Brothers/Big Sisters, Boys & Girls Clubs, and scouting programs.

In 1959, they established the Fred C. and Katherine B. Andersen Foundation to formalize their philanthropic efforts and to direct their legacy.

Just one year after its founding, the Foundation began its perpetual support of Children's Home because the Andersens felt children deserve a safe and stable environment.

The Foundation has supported Children's Home general operations, pre- and postadoption services, the Little Red Stocking holiday fundraising campaign, and programs in Washington County, Minnesota, where the Andersens lived prior to their passing. The Foundation continues to support Children's Home because our child-centered approach and best practices deliver excellent results for children and families.

Even beyond their lives — Mr. Andersen passed away in 1979 and Mrs. Andersen in 1996 — the Andersens are providing hope and opportunity for many through adoption.


