Each foster parent and any adult in the home in a parenting role is required to participate in a minimum of 12 hours of training per year to develop and enhance their skills in providing foster care services. Orientation and training hours can and should take place in a variety of settings and through a variety of methods. Except for licensing specific trainings (mandated reporting, C.A.R.S., etc.), license holders may not count the hours for the exact same training more than once in their tenure as a foster parent. Example: attendance at workshops, books that you have read (a book = 1 training hour), participation in a Parent Support Group, and/or consultation with the child's therapist, teacher, medical professional, etc.

CHILDREN'S MENTAL HEALTH TRAINING

*A minimum of **one hour** of training per year must be in the area of Children's Mental Health, and be approved by your worker. The training should include any of the following keywords: Attachment, Trauma, Depression, Resiliency, Medication (psychotropic), Autism/Pervasive Developmental Disorder, Anxiety, Bipolar, Behavior Disorders, Attention Deficit Hyperactivity Disorder (ADHD), Development, Eating Disorders.*

FETAL ALCOHOL SPECTRUM DISORDERS TRAINING

*A minimum of **one hour** of training per year must be in the area of Fetal Alcohol Spectrum Disorders, and be approved by your worker. The training should include any of the following keywords: Fetal Alcohol Spectrum Disorders, Alcohol Related Birth Defects, Alcohol Related Neurodevelopmental Disorder, Partial Fetal Alcohol Syndrome, Prenatal Exposure to Alcohol. Must include parenting strategies and skills, not just a general overview of the topic.*

Recommended annually per [Minnesota Rules, part 2960.3070](#):

- 2 hours social equity, racial/cultural identity development;
- 2 hours SOGIE, human sexual development, sexualized behavior;
- 2 hours de-escalation, crisis intervention and parental self-regulation skills;
- 2 hours specifically related to the unique needs or strengths of a child in their care or expected to be placed in their care; may include sessions with a child's therapist, educational specialists or medical providers to learn more about meeting an individual child's needs;
- 2 hours secondary trauma, self-care, addressing own trauma or mental health; foster parent's own therapy or attendance at self-care retreat counts.
