ECUADOR

Children eligible for adoption from Ecuador typically range in age from 2 to 15 years. Children become eligible for international adoption after they receive "Sentencia de Adoptabilitdad." They are cared for in private and government-run orphanages where access to resources can widely vary. The greatest need is for families to be open to school-age children, sibling groups and children with identified needs and histories that may include trauma. Children's Home is Hague accredited.

Eligible Families

- Parents must be age 25-51 at time of child referral and can be no less than 14 years and no more than 45 years older than the child to be adopted.
- Single women may adopt.
- If married, heterosexual couples must be married at least three years at home study approval.
- Parents cannot have serious physical or mental health concerns; no criminal history.
- Families can be matched to a waiting child after their home study is complete.
- Travel timelines vary case-by-case.
- One trip to Ecuador for a minimum 8-10 weeks is required; at least one parent must remain in country the entire trip. Parents have child in custody while in country.

Care of the Child - Includes costs for food, clothing, shelter and medical care; foster care services, orphanage care; and any other services provided directly to the child(ren). (\$1,500)

Translation and Documents - Includes the costs for obtaining, translating, or copying records or documents required to complete the adoption, costs for the child's Convention court documents, adoption certificate and other documents related to the adoption. (\$700)

An added \$500 applies to adoptions of 2 siblings or \$1,000 to sibling groups of 3 or more.

Foreign Program Expenses - Includes personnel costs, administrative overhead, training, education, legal services, communications, and any other costs related to providing adoption
